# The Benefits



There is enormous collegiality at Lammas. Staff feel welcome and supported. Professional development is differentiated so everyone can continue to grow as professionals. The Trust has a well-developed Masters programme.

Professional learning is planned in outline and is then fleshed out to take into account school, departmental and team, as well as individual needs. We review the programme and provision every year to take into account the staff profile. Provision includes induction, mentoring and coaching.

Staff regularly get together to spend time socially and after work and at various times there have been team sports, film, pottery and 'gin 'n jazz'. Staff and student wellbeing is taken seriously and we ensure that our policies, systems and processes are designed to allow colleagues to achieve a good balance between their personal and professional lives.

The Trust has adopted the School Teachers Pay and Conditions Document (STPCD) and Teachers Standards for Teachers, and the National Joint Council (NJC) agreement for support staff. Lammas is in Waltham Forest and as such the Outer London Allowance applies.

The London Borough of Waltham Forest that offers good and outstanding local schools and amenities. East London is diverse and as a result there are things to do for everyone. Stratford with its Olympic legacy (in the shape of the Aquatics Centre and Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park), Walthamstow and Leyton each have their own characteristics and the neighbouring Borough of Hackney has its own varied arts, culture and sports scenes.

More broadly, London itself offers a host of opportunities for you at all stages of your career and in your own personal life.

There are excellent transport links to Lammas with the closest tube stations being Walthamstow on the Victoria Line and Leyton on the Central Line. Lea Bridge Station (overground) is also close by. A number of bus routes serves the school as well. There is onsite, free parking for staff and secure bicycle storage.

### The Department

The Physical Education curriculum at Lammas has been designed to provide a broad and balanced programme of activities which ensure that students gain a range of experiences in a variety of sporting scenarios. We look to inspire students to have a love of sport whether that means performing, spectating or coaching. We provide extensive opportunities for all these to be experienced.

At Key Stage 3 and 4 up to year 10 students have four 1 hour lessons across a two week timetable with 1 lessons of core PE in Year 11. In core PE students are taught in single gender classes.

At GCSE we follow the AQA specification which starts in year 9 where students receive 5 lessons across the two week timetable and are taught within their mixed gender GCSE class. This increases to 6 lessons in year 11. As a department we also offer level 2 and 3 BTEC sport courses as well as AQA A-Level PE. The department benefits from a fully equipped sports hall, outdoor climbing wall, hardcourt area, onsite field and a small gym. We also have the use of a small hall when needed.

There are 6 full time PE teachers in the department who work closely and are a well-integrated team, employing a variety of teaching methods to cope with a variety of situations. We are also happy to say that a number of colleagues from outside the department support in curriculum and extra-curricular scenarios.

The PE department at Lammas is widely known for it's extra curricular programme being both extensive and well supported by students and is seen as an integral part of the work of the department as a whole. We field competitive sides at all levels of competition specialising in basketball and football amongst others and have gained success in local, regional and national competitions across a variety of these sports. The successful candidate would complement the existing work of the department and hopefully enhance the provision to all students.





The Griffin Schools Trust is a Head-led Trust.
